Goals for the Partnership

- Increase the rigor of the academic programming offered to students at Cumberland Christian School.
- Help our CCS students become acclimated to the nature and demands of college campus instruction.

Goals for the Partnership

- Help CCS graduates with reduction of costs for college instruction.
- Providing more options in course offerings for and programs available to CCS students.

What the Partnership is NOT Meant to Do

- Replace instruction at CCS.
- Replace our intent to develop a Biblical Worldview in the minds of our students.

Dual Credit Courses

These courses are taught by our teachers on our campus.

Syllabi are being developed that describe our courses, so that CCC can account for course content adequately matching .

Our teachers provide a resume and transcripts, so that CCC can validate teacher credentials.

Dual Credit Courses

Paperwork must be completed to be admitted to the program.

This paperwork must be accompanied by an administrative fee of \$40/credit for CCC to process all records.

Students may earn up to 30 credits in this program.

Dual Credit Courses

Courses currently being considered for dual credit include

Dual Credit Courses

Courses which would be considered for dual credit in the near future include

US History 6

Courses which would be considered for dual credit with curricular improvement include

AP Chemistry 8

AP Physics 8

Dual Enrollment Courses

These courses are taught by CCC professors on the CCC campus.

Paperwork must be completed to be admitted to the program.

The paperwork must be accompanied by an administrative fee of \$85/credit for CCC.

CCS and CCC will both enroll the student in their institutions.

Dual Enrollment Courses

Virtually the entire course offerings of CCC are available to Dually Enrolled students.

Students will need to take courses that **DO NOT** conflict with their schedule at CCS.

We are working on our course schedule for next year to minimize conflicts with the CCC offerings.

After Graduation from CCS

Students could continue taking courses at the CCC for the usual fees.

After Graduation from CCS

Several colleges offer courses on the CCC campus that allow students to complete an undergraduate degree there. These include
